- **Communication** Detail of the standard lines of communication in the company.
- Auditing Brief outline of how the company monitors its rules and the internal auditing practice.
- Disciplinary guidelines Guide to disciplinary standards and actions for specific situations.
- **Response** Outline of various responses and actions to be taken with problems that may arise.

Needless to say, all the above makes perfect sense for the legitimacy of any company. Simply put, this compliance program can protect an organization from risk and help the company avoid compromising situations. What's more, a compliance program is designed to ensure that the company keeps in line with strategic planning and stays on course to reach set goals or objectives.

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
